



## Format and Contest Description

### Formats

**Scramble** – In this format, each player hits a tee shot. Then the team picks the best tee shot of the foursome, picking up their ball and moving it to the best tee shot. Each player then hits a shot from that spot. Once again the team picks the best shot and moves their balls to there and hits the next shot. This continues until the ball is in the hole. There is only one score per hole for the foursome.

**Shamble** – Each player hits a tee shot. The team picks the best tee shot of the foursome and continues to play their own ball from there until each player finishes the hole. Each player must mark a score per hole.

**Best Ball** – Each player plays his own ball and the team marks down the lowest score per hole from the foursome.

**Play your own ball** – Each player of the foursome plays his own ball and each player must mark his own score for each hole.



### Contests

**Straightest drive** – Each player hits a tee shot and if you think that you are closest to the line, you move the sign to where your ball is, you then write your name on the next line of the sign. This is available on hole #1 or #9.

**Longest drive** – Each player hits a tee shot and if you hit it past the existing long drive, you write your name on the sign and move it to where your drive is. This is available on hole #1 and #9.

**Closest to the pin** – Each player hits a shot and if you think that your shot is closest to the pin, you take the tape measure and write your name and distance from the hole on the sign provided. This is available on hole #6, #8, #10 and #16.

**The putting challenge** – We will have one of our golf professionals assist you on this contest. A three or four hole putting “obstacle course” is set up on one of our practice putting greens. Each hole gets progressively more difficult with the placement of string, rocks, sand, etc. You can assign the number of putts for each hole or just make it a one putt per hole contest.
